- Original Rabies Certificate and Coggins papers are required. A copy of both the Rabies Certificate and the Coggins papers must be handed into the office by June 15th as well as carried with the animal when showing.
- All equines in lead line classes must be at least 2 years old. No stallions or jacks are allowed. All equines shown in riding and driving classes must be 3 years of age or older.
- All leased equines must have been officially designated as the member's project animal by June 15 of the current year. A copy of the completed Equine or Donkey/ Mule Animal Project Certificate must be on file with your County Cooperative Extension office.
- Members who do not own or are not using a family-owned equine may designate two non-owned equines as their project animals (Animal Project Certificates) but **can only show one.**
- All judging is on the Danish System of Excellent, Good, and Worthy. No Award is for not completing class, poor sportsmanship, or lameness of horse or pony.
- All stalls and barn areas must be thoroughly cleaned before departure, either on Friday or Sunday if the youth is staying for all four days. If the stalls are not cleaned, the premiums for that youth will be withheld, and the barn will not be available for use in future fair seasons.
- Riders can only compete at the level which they have been evaluated.
- For all Divisions, ponies = under 14.2 hands.
- Cloverbud riders: youth aged 5-8 (4-H age)
- Junior riders: youth aged 8-13 (4-H age)
- Senior riders: youth aged 14-18 (4-H age)

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Sportsmanship, horsemanship, and 4-H appropriate behavior will make everyone a winner!
