

Showing Your Cat in 4-H



How to prepare:

- 1. Veterinary visit
 - Your cat is required to have rabies vaccination. It is suggested your cat also receives Feline Distemper and Feline Leukemia Vaccine.
- 2. Check for external and internal parasites
 - Look for fleas or signs of fleas on your cat.
 - Check ears for signs of mites.
 - Recommended that a flea and tick preventative be used on any cat you plan to show.
 - You will not be allowed to show if parasites are present.
- 3. Prepare your showmanship presentation.
 - Start on this a few weeks before the fair.
 - o Practice handling the cat so it's comfortable
- 4. Groom 2-3 times per week
 - This prevents matts in hair and keeps your cat used to being handled.
- 5. Bathe your cat 2-3 days before the show
 - By doing it early, you allow the natural oils in your cat's hair to return
 - Also, some cats will shed more after bathing and this will keep your cat from shedding in the show.
- 6. Trim toenails
 - All cats should have their nails trimmed
 - Best if done 2-3 days before the show
- 7. Clean around ears and eyes
 - To make sure there is no build up around eyes or in ears, wipe with a moist cotton ball to clean
- 8. Any cats that display symptoms of sickness, will not be eligible to show.

What to bring:

- 1.Cat
- 2. Carrier
- 3. Food and water
- 4. Litter pan with litter
- 5. Towel or blanket
- 6. Cage cover
- 7. Grooming supplies

What to include in your showmanship presentation:

- 1. Your name and age
- 2. Cat's name, age and breed
- 3. if your cat is spayed/neutered
- 4. How you care for your cat
- 5. What vaccinations your cat had
- 6. What health treatments your cat gets
- 7. What your cat eats and how much
- 8. How often do you groom
- 9. How did you prepare for show
- 10. Something special about your cat

What to wear:

- White long sleeve shirt, tucked in
- Long pants
- Closed toe shoes

Important dates:

June 1st: Deadline to enroll in 4-H and submit 4-H cat identification. July 15th: Deadline to submit animal entry form, rabies vaccine certificate and fair eligibility form.
